Hazard(s) addressed	Flooding/ Icing / sliding off road
Describing the Action	
Background/issue addressed	Mill Ha Road has a low area of the road along side Trough Creek. The distance of the road that is impacted by weather is 400 feet. The side of the Creek that the road is on has been stabilized with Riffraff in the past. Flooding occurs during heavy rain and icing occurs during the winter months. Icing can occur on the road which increases the rick of car sliding off the road into the Creek. There is no guide rail along T368 and is road is traveled by school buses and CART. The worst section of road is a 50ft section located with the creek on one side and steep rock bank on the other side which allows for mini day light.

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Action Title	Cree Manor Stormwater
Assessing the Risk	
Hazard(s) addressed	Flooding, pooling water
Describing the Action	
Background/issue addressed	Water from above Rt. 26 flows through the Cree Manor development and is supposed to flow under Station Rd. and on to Crooked Creek. The drain under Station Rd. is too high to take the water that is laying in the ditch.
Action description	This has not been happening because of the slope of the drainage areas and drains being blocked

Existing or future action	We are working to clear the inlet pipes and drains to the lower drainage area, and have been petitioning the State to lower the drain under Station Rd. so that the water fill stop pooling at the bottom of Cree Manor and go on towards the creek
